

Climate and Corruption Atlas


BRAZIL 2022



Complex political, economic and cultural changes, involving a variety of agents, are needed to achieve the Paris Agreement goals. An additional challenge to this process, hardly explored, imposes itself in the process: corruption in the interventions to tackle climate change.

With the "Climate and Corruption Atlas", Transparency International Brazil presents the first study to systematise the interrelationships between corruption and climate change in Brazil, identifying five relevant impacts, 15 corruption practices and ten concrete cases which negatively affect the climate agenda in the country.

The table below presents the synthesis of the "Climate and Corruption Atlas", with information from ten concrete corruption cases that have recently occurred in Brazil (map on opposite page).



GREEN GRABBING IN CARBON MARKETS

(Marajó Island, Pará state) Land grabbing generates fraudulent carbon credits and usurps the rights of traditional communities in Extractive Reserves.

BOTTOMLESS PIT IN THE SEMI-ARID REGION

(Northeastern Semiarid) Corruption cases in the National Department of Works Against Droughts harm the strengthening of climate resilience of populations in the semi-arid region.

THE BRAZILIAN WILD WEST

(Formosa do Rio Preto, West of Bahia state) The purchase of judicial decisions led to the legitimization of frauds in real estate registries and land grabbing associated with deforestation.

> New WINDS, OLD PRACTICES (Northeast of Bahia state) Overpricing in wind power generation contracts diverted resources from the energy transition process.

CORRUPTING THE LAW TO UNDERMINE RIGHTS

(Brasília) Undue influence and disinformation favour the approval of laws authorising mineral exploitation on indigenous lands.

LAUNDERING OF TIMBER

(South of Amazonas state) Bribery of public and private agents facilitated fraud associated with timber laundering and smuggling

FREE RIDES ON PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION (Rio de Janeiro)

Embezzlement in the bus sector allowed abusive fare increases and undermined the quality of public transportation.

FREEZING OF CLIMATE

(Amazon and Brasília) Paralysis of climate funds and selection of projects without technical criteria have prevented their effective use for climate action.

THE FOSSIL FUEL LOBBY

(Santa Catarina) Political capture and disinformation promote energy policies that encourage electricity generation from fossil sources.

DOWNHILL

(Petrópolis, Rio de Janeiro) Corruption in emergency works contracted to combat the effects of heavy rains leads to lack of adaptation and to further tragedies.

10 RECOMMENDATIONS TO COMBAT CORRUPTION AFFECTING CLIMATE ACTION

Based on the mapping of impacts and corruption practices, we identified a list of actions to be pursued, such as the regulation of lobbying, integrity policies and practices in public agencies and companies related to the climate agenda, the transparency of carbon markets and climate finance, and the fight against fake news.

The implementation of these proposals must include a wide range of actors, including federal, state and municipal governments and legislatures, anti-corruption and anti-money laundering bodies, oversight bodies, and the private sector.
